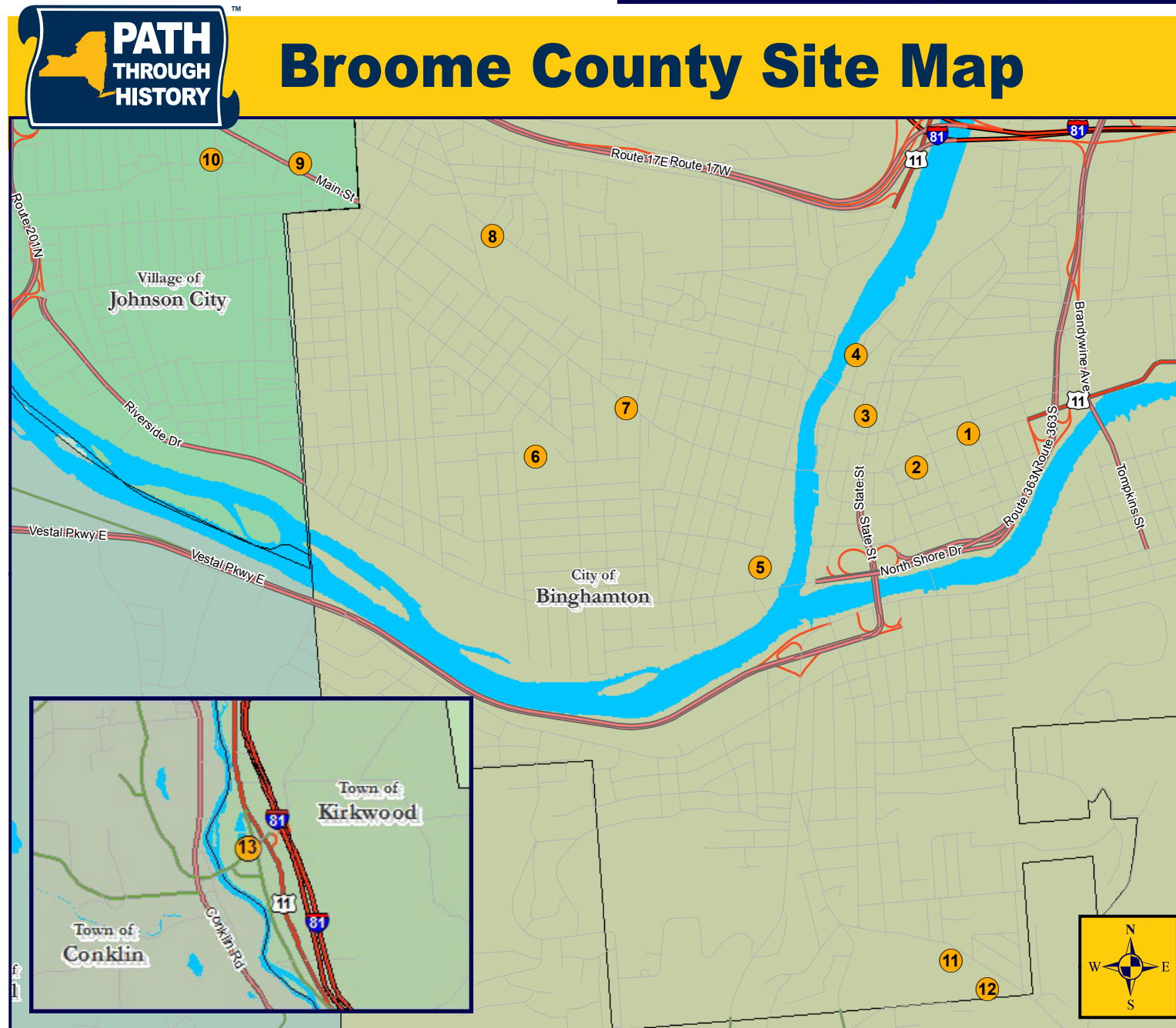
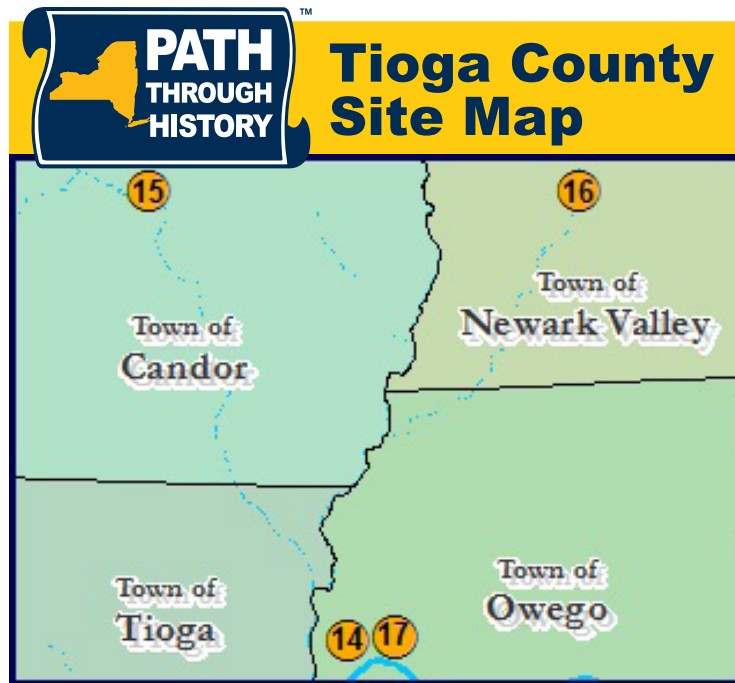


FRIDAY & SATURDAY EVENTS (October 5 & 6)

110 Front Street, Owego. Exhibit Runs October 5 – 13, Tuesday - Saturday from 10AM – 4PM. Show includes over two dozen *old photos of train stations in Tioga County*. Display includes *original control switch 19* that directed trains to different tracks. As early as **1828**, the *first local railroad* was planned and over the *next 50 years many small local railroads flourished*. By 1900, only the *Erie, Lehigh, and the Lackawanna* railroads remained with *Owego the hub for all three* with dozens of sidings, yards and crossing.
